

Personal and Indefinite Pronouns

A **personal pronoun** is a word that is used in the place of a specific noun or another pronoun: *I, mine, me, we, our, ours, us, you, your, yours, he, his, him, she, her, hers, it, its, they, their, theirs, and them.*

Indefinite pronouns refer to persons or things generally: *another, anybody, anyone, anything, both, each, either, everyone, everybody, everything, few, many, most, neither, no one, nobody, nothing, one, several, somebody, and someone.*
